***Cold Comfort Farm* by Stella Gibbons (1932)**

Cold Comfort Farm, which gave us the immortal line “I saw something nasty in the woodshed” is best remembered as a humorous satire on the contemporary, overblown and pessimistic novels of rural life, such as those by Mary Webb.

However, *Cold Comfort Farm* also satirises other fads of contemporary life – the ‘bright young things’, films, evangelical preaching, D.H. Lawrence, Freudian theory – and many more.

Never out of print, this is a joyful, even romantic novel, which is a delight to read.

As well as exploring its themes, we shall discuss the nature of satire as a literary genre.
